All That Glitters Is Not Gold

Proverbs 25: 11-12 A word fitly spoken is like apples of gold in pictures of silver. As an earring of gold, and an ornament of fine gold, so is a wise reprover upon an obedient ear.

Martin Luther: This life therefore is not righteousness, but growth in righteousness, not health but healing, not being but becoming, not rest but exercise. We are not yet what we shall be but we are growing toward it, the process is not yet finished but it is going on, this is not the end, but it is the road. All does not yet gleam in glory but all is being purified.

Think with me today about the gleaming quality of everything around us during Advent / Christmas seasons. Regardless of the season when you or I are genuinely in the Spirit of God, living, breathing in God's holy presence, there is a brightness about everything, an incandescence that doesn't die but gathers in an overwhelming mystery that is God. Crocuses pushing up through the snow, birds gently perching on the evergreen branch, a solitary pine tree on a distant hill, geese honking in flight overhead, a rainbow trapped in a drop of dew...it's all stunning and can transport and transform our spirit.

Suppose all this glorious beauty is one of the garments God wears, changing with the seasons and offering daily variations on creation themes. Maybe God wears the smiles on our faces when something wonderful is happening to or around us – simply observe the glow on parents' faces as their child smiles during our puppet ministry, or scores a goal at a soccer match, or comes home announcing they've been selected to sit first chair cello.

For communing with God, I am a sunrise/sunset kind of person. I love watching the ebb and flow of light and how it changes the appearance of everything. I rise while it's still dark every day, and have my first cup of coffee and breakfast staring out our picture window waiting for the first birds to arrive at the feeders. Some mornings I am greeted by a family of rabbits, some by a beautiful red fox. This little time I commune with God and creation is the most peaceful part of my day. What's your best time for catching the gleam in God eye, and a deep satisfaction with all that is?

If you look - you will see God everywhere, in everything that is. All human matter is in the process of becoming spirit - may even indeed *be* spirit. It's all part of God's great plan for all of creation. And unless you and I are reborn in the Spirit, as Jesus once told Nicodemus, there are so many parts of God's kingdom we'll not be able to see well enough to enter.
