Did you know how surprised most people are to learn that there are very few sayings or stories of Jesus found uniformly in all four gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John? There really aren't that many.

Here's one: Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me; and anyone who welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me.

If you grew up Christian, surely, you've heard this saying tossed about – maybe before the preacher asked for volunteers to help with a church-wide clean up event.

Let's stop and think about what's going on here. Jesus is saying there is a moral between us, our neighbor, the Christ, and God.

This is an amazing chain of being that isn't evident to the casual observer. This new Christ-like way of seeing – this new way of shaping reality – is the core and foundation of the entire Christian revelation and revolution.

This saying of Jesus' is designed to reshape our understanding of who God is and where God is - of who we are and where we are, too.


God in Jesus is no longer out there. Religions from the beginning of time have imagined God as out there somewhere.

Blessing Box Reminders

When outside temperatures begin to freeze, please do not place items like glass bottled drinks, carbonated beverages, and any liquids in thin plastic containers into the Blessing Box, as they can freeze and potentially burst or become unusable in cold weather.

Key points to remember:

Glass containers: These are prone to breaking when frozen. **Canned drinks with high carbonation:** The pressure from freezing can cause the cans to explode.

Thin plastic containers: These can crack or break when exposed to extreme cold.

Instead, focus on donating items such as:

canned goods with pull tabs, individually packaged snacks, dry goods like pasta and rice, warm clothing items like hats and gloves, and hygiene products with sturdy packaging.
