Saint Camillus of Lellis (1550-1614)

Camillus was the founder of the Ministers of the Sick. He was born at Bocchianico in the Abruzzi, and as an adult he joined the Venetian army to fight against the Turks. Camillus was very tall for his day, 6 feet 6 inches, he is reputed to have had a hot temper and was addicted to gambling. Fighting against the Turks he contracted an incurable disease of the legs. In 1574 he lost everything he owned in gambling debts; within the year he experienced a religious conversion to Christianity. Camillus enlisted as a Franciscan, but his health suffered from living such an austere lifestyle and so he never professed the order. Instead he joined the staff of the hospital of San Giacomo, Rome where he eventually became the bursar.


In association with his spiritual advisor, Philip Neri, Camillus, now a priest, founded in 1585 a congregation of male nurses, who pledged themselves to serve those stricken with the plague, the sick in the hospitals, and those in prisons. In 1595 and 1601 some of Camillus nurses served as medics on the battlefields in Hungary and Croatia...they were the first recorded examples of a military ambulance unit. In Rome and in Naples they founded hospitals and also served as medics to the galley slaves on ships; in both places many lost their lives through contracting the plague from their patients.

Camillus was a pioneer in insisting on lots of fresh air, clean linens, suitable diet, and the isolation of infected patients, and he lived to see his institute found 15 houses and 8 hospitals. Although Camillus suffered with a variety of serious illnesses himself, he continued to tend his sick patients personally right up to the end of his life. He died in Genoa in 1614 and was canonized in 1746. He is the patron saint of the nurses and the sick. His feast day is July 14.

2025 Offering Envelopes

If you need to add or remove your name from our list of 2025 donors with offering envelopes, then please let our Treasurer know as soon as possible. If you have 2024 envelopes and want a new set for 2025 then you do not need to do anything as this year's list will be updated to incorporate requested additions and deletions before the order is placed. The church needs to order our 2025 offering envelopes by mid-October so they can be printed



and received before the end of the year. Although this precedes Stewardship Sunday, most of our members are regular contributors and know whether they want offering envelopes for 2025.

HUMC Libraries

Did you know we have THREE libraries at HUMC? The "Main Library" is on the left in the preschool wing. Both adult and children's books are arranged according to the Dewey Decimal system and includes numerous Bible and faith resources, and both fiction and nonfiction suitable to both children and adults. The check-out box is located on the cabinet on the non-window side/long side of the room.

The "Branch Library" is a nook in the wall directly across the aisle from the sanctuary entrance. It holds a rotating collection of adult/children titles from the Main Library and Mobile Library (see below). To borrow, legibly complete the name and date on the library card, and place the library card in the check-out box on the bottom shelf of the "nook.".

The "Mobile Library," also called the "United Women in Faith (UWF) Library," resides in a supply room adjacent to the Fellowship Hall and is brought out for UWF meetings and other events, such as Wednesday Night dinners. The check-out box is located on the cart. Some books available in the "Branch Library" are those that have been moved from the "Mobile Library" and are part of the permanent "Main Library."

Peruse, and borrow, books from any of the three. To borrow a book, legibly complete the name and date on the library card found at the back of the book and place it in the check-out box. Beginning in October blurbs about some books in the Branch Library occasionally will appear in the *Pulse*. (See below!)
