Bridges

Jesus said to him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life." John 14.6

"And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and take you to myself, so that where I am you may be also. And you know the place where I am going." John 14:3-4

Think with me today about bridges. No one knows who made the first bridge. Probably some ancient soul got the idea of making a foot bridge of some kind by stumbling across a fallen tree or a natural arch of stone crossing a stream. By the time of the ancient Greeks and Romans, pontoon bridges were regularly used by their armies, and their roads often crossed creeks and chasms on stone bridges. Most of the time we don't take much notice of bridges; they're simply there. We go our merry way without appreciating the efforts someone took to make our travels easier. When I was a kid, I'd walk from my home to the stores downtown. I had to cross a bridge that spanned railroad tracks below. The wooden planks of the bridge were spaced apart wide enough to see the tracks, trains and people below...a little unnerving at first crossing.

Sometimes bridges are large enough or magnificent enough to be viewed with awe like some of the bridges in London, Paris, and the Golden Gate bridge in San Francisco. How about the Straits of Mackinac Bridge in Michigan? It took over 20 years to build, is 5 miles long and required over 100 thousand tons of cement just for the footings. I don't know if this still happens but the bridge used to be closed to cars for a few hours each Labor Day so that people could walk from one end to the


other to marvel at this engineering achievement. It is a marvelous comparison with the old wooden bridges or the covered bridges that have all but disappeared.

Think about bridges today and some that you've seen, crossed and admired. Think about how important they are to the world's commerce. Then think of the figurative bridges you've crossed to connect with other people. Think about the bridges you've burned. Think about the bridges we've tried to cross in order to connect with God. Think about the bridge God used to connect with us...this Jesus who is Christ. And, let's be grateful for bridges.

Blessing Box Reminders

When outside temperatures begin to freeze, please do not place items like glass bottled drinks, carbonated beverages, and any liquids in thin plastic containers into the Blessing Box, as they can freeze and potentially burst or become unusable in cold weather.

Key points to remember:

Glass containers: These are prone to breaking when frozen.

Canned drinks with high carbonation: The pressure from freezing can cause the cans to explode.

Thin plastic containers: These can crack or break when exposed to extreme cold.



Instead, focus on donating items such as:

canned goods with pull tabs, individually packaged snacks, dry goods like pasta and rice, warm clothing items like hats and gloves, and hygiene products with sturdy packaging.
