Self-Identity

And Jesus said to him, "Blessed are you, Simon bar Jonah! And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church. Matthew 16:17a, 18a.

"I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God, who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty. Revelation 1:8

Ponder with me today the mysteries of self-identity. Who are you really? I suppose we all have three identities: public, private and secret. Who knows us completely except God?

If you had to identify yourself to a visitor from another world, how would you describe yourself? In the novel Gathering Home, Vicki Covington describes a scene in which Whitney Gaines, who was adopted at birth, goes to a home for unwed mothers to discover who her birth mother was. Despite all Whitney knows about herself as a young woman, the information she seeks will affect her future. It is all she can do not to cry as she reads the papers that shed light on her beginning. Think of the people who have had amnesia and lost memory of who they are and where they belong. It is one of the most disorienting things that could happen to a person. We are who we are, and it makes a difference to us to know who we are and from whence we came. In our early life a major part of our learning curve is discovering who we think we are, who others think we are, and who we want to genuinely be.

The promise of religious experience is that it puts us in touch with our truest selves, with the inner beings that most completely determine our lives. In the Bible, people often receive new names after an encounter with God – names reflecting their new status in their heavenly relationship. Ponder your own identity this week and ask yourself whether it is centered in such an encounter.

Our nursery caregiver, Rosalie Koch, is at church every



Blessing Box Reminders

When outside temperatures begin to freeze, please do not place items like bottled drinks. carbonated glass beverages, and any liquids in thin plastic



containers into the Blessing Box, as they can freeze and potentially burst or become unusable in cold weather.

Key points to remember:

Glass containers: These are prone to breaking when frozen.

Canned drinks with high carbonation: The pressure from freezing can cause the cans to explode.

Thin plastic containers: These can crack or break when exposed to extreme cold.

Instead, focus on donating items such as:

canned goods with pull tabs, individually packaged snacks, dry goods like pasta and rice, warm clothing items like hats and gloves, and hygiene products with sturdy packaging.
