
#### Radio

Reminisce with me a little today about the power of radio and its place in God's world. You and I take radio for granted and listen to it in our cars as we commute to work or venture out into the great roar of Short Pump and Southside traffic. We don't have a radio in our cars anymore - we have an audio sound system: Bose, JBL, Sony etc. We can turn those babies up so loud people in the cars behind and beside us can listen even with the windows up and the AC on. Boom Baboom - Boom Baboom. All this bears little resemblance to the radio I remember as a child. First, there was no instant ON...the vacuum tubes took a bit of warming up. Radio was fantastic, magical. It brought the world to our doorsteps, brought a world of laughter, romance, adventure and thrills. We kids would sneak small transistor radios into elementary school in the fall to listen to the World Series - and then rush home after school, warm up the radio and catch the rest of the game. As a kid I would hear radio broadcasts like: Lum & Abner, Gun Smoke, The Shadow, Burns and Allen, Jack Benny, The Great Gildersleeve, War of the Worlds. You can still hear many of these shows on the Big Broadcast every Sunday night at 7 p.m. on WAMU 88.5 FM. Here's what made radio so great – the stage the actors strode upon was the creative imagination of everyone listening. People heard all the great events of history - Edward VIII's abdication, the announcement that the Japanese had bombed Pearl Harbor, FDR's and Churchill's speeches. Every night I would go to bed and eventually find sleep while listening to some program on the radio. Because of a wonderful little quality of AM radio called *skip*, as a child growing up in Charlottesville, I could listen to WBZ in Boston or WOWO in Fort Wayne...and imagine the exciting things going on in those far away cities. What excitement. What fun. To this day I usually fall asleep at night listening to VPM music or WETA. I put my earbuds in every morning at 5 a.m. and awaken to the first sounds of what's going on in the world. Sometime in the 1950s a popular pastor, Charles Wellborn, preached a sermon called *God Speaking*, in which he presented God as speaking directly to the listening audience. I wonder if God still doesn't speak to us through the music, news and joy of simply *hearing* about what's new in the world - this day the Lord has made!

#### **Blessing Box Reminders**

When outside temperatures begin to freeze, please do not place items like glass bottled drinks, carbonated beverages, and any liquids in thin plastic containers into the Blessing Box, as they can freeze and potentially burst or become unusable in cold weather.

Key points to remember:

**Glass containers:** These are prone to breaking when frozen.

Canned drinks with high carbonation: The pressure from freezing can cause the cans to explode.

Thin plastic containers: These can crack or break when exposed to extreme cold.



Instead, focus on donating items such as:

canned goods with pull tabs, individually packaged snacks, dry goods like pasta and rice, warm clothing items like hats and gloves, and hygiene products with sturdy packaging.
